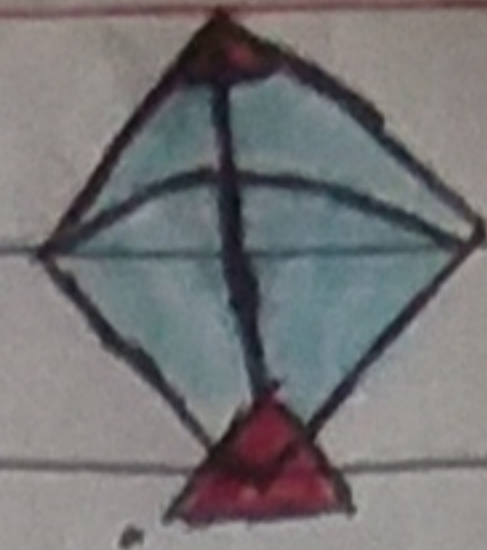
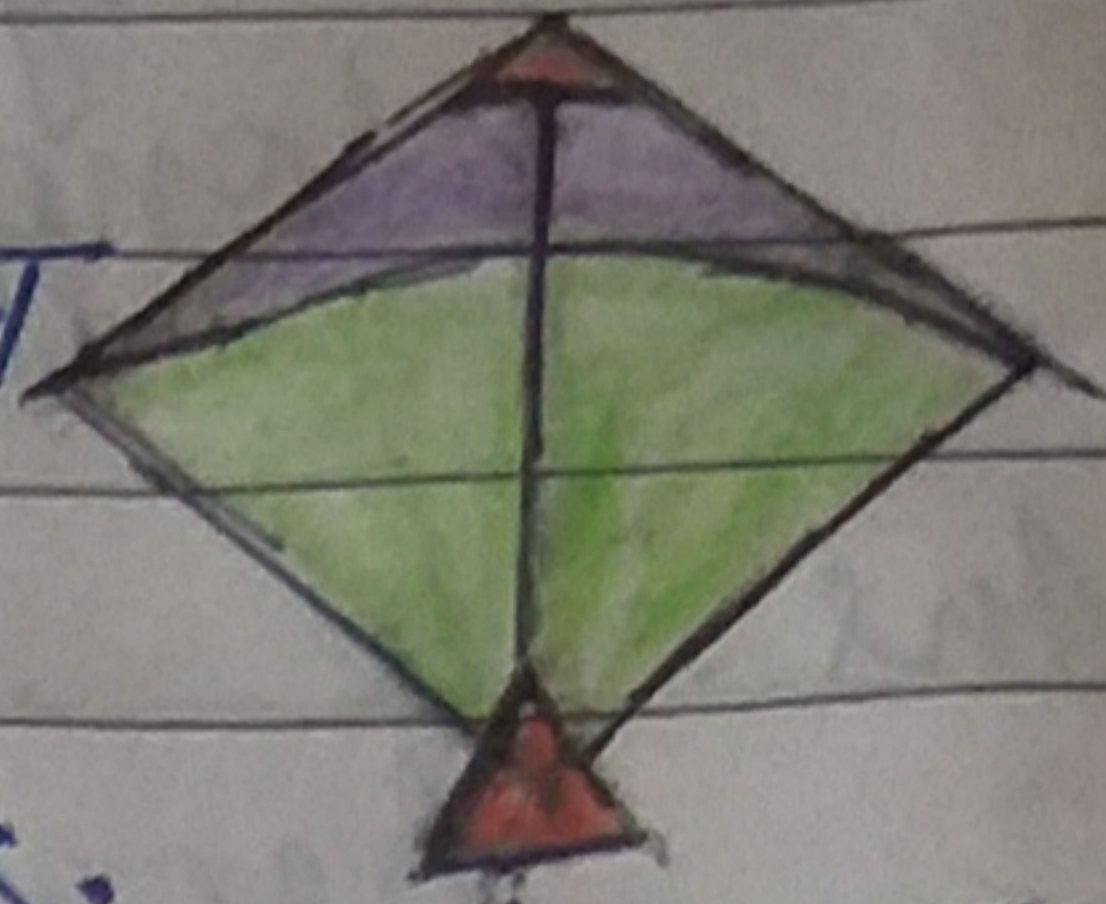


POEM - THE KITE

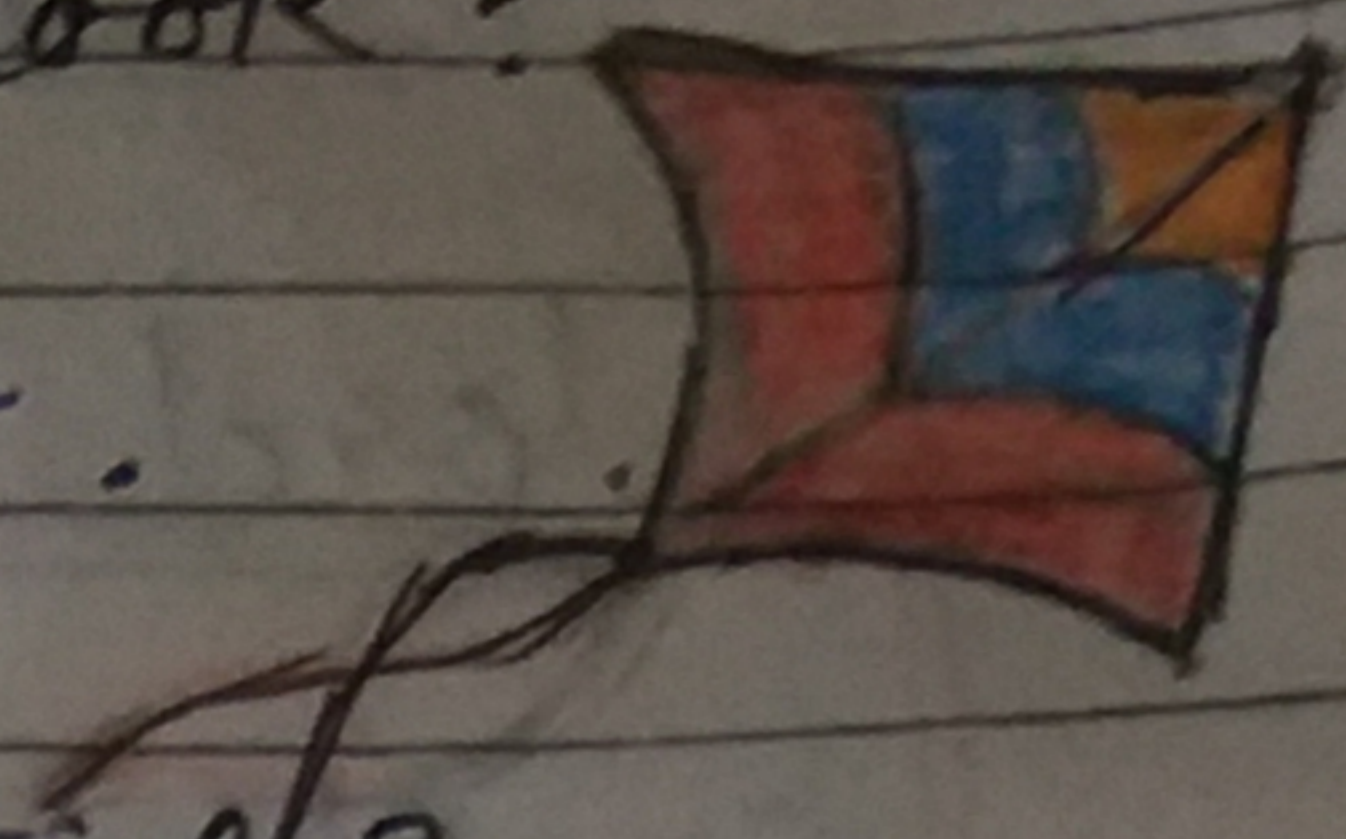
Question / Answer

Q.3. How does it snap its tail?

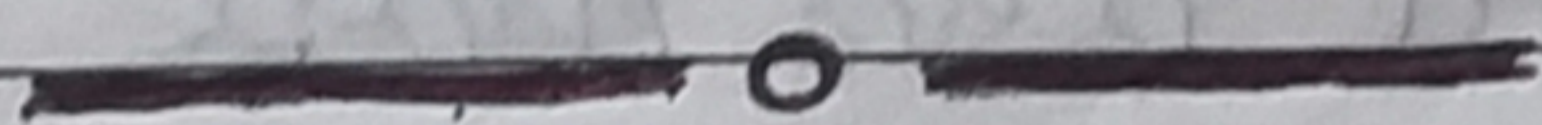
Ans. It snaps its tail with a dive and dip.
